Recently someone asked me to name the biggest challenge that libraries face today. This isn't the first time I've been asked this question, and it certainly won't be the last. At the time, I answered something about the challenge of finding meeting space for all of the groups who want to use our library. After further consideration, I realized that I gave the wrong answer.

The biggest challenge that all libraries face is that many non-active library users erroneously believe the library is irrelevant, or not used, or meant for someone else. If I had that conversation about a library's biggest challenge again today, my answer would be very different. I would say,

"A library's biggest challenge is making sure that everyone knows about the outstanding programs available, the many services we offer, the opportunities to learn and have fun and meet friends and grow.

"We strive every day to meet the needs of the entire service population, and realizing that many members of our community don't know about the outstanding resource that is waiting for them, or worse, think that the library is for other people, is very upsetting to a librarian.

"Contrary to legend, librarians don't just 'sit around and read books all day.' We actively share the collected knowledge and resources and ideas and adventures from the entire human experience with the community, our friends and neighbors, who contribute their own experiences and perspectives. We are literally advancing the human race every day!

"To accomplish this most effectively, though, everyone needs to take part in the process. Getting the word out...that's the challenge."

Every single resident of the Municipality of Mt. Lebanon is a patron of our library. Some of you may have never attended a program or even borrowed an eBook. Maybe you feel that you don't need the library; that it's just for little kids, or the underprivileged. You may never need to call the fire department either, or seek help from the police, but you would never assume those services are only meant for someone else, right? So why assume that about the library?

This is your library. It belongs to you, and your neighbor, and your mail carrier. The library is here for the doctors, the janitors, the football players, the teachers; the children, teens, Millennials, Gen-Xers, and Baby Boomers; the avid readers and those who have never opened a book; the newly arrived-immigrant and the fourth-generation Pittsburgher. We are here for all of you.

Your local, county, and state tax dollars and generous donations pay for this building and its staff, for the materials, the programs, and the computers. You volunteer tens of thousands of hours every year. You attend programs, participate in discussions, share ideas, display artwork and collections, and contribute to the community in a thousand ways. You make our community, and the world, a better place.

Because of you, Mt. Lebanon boasts one of the best libraries in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as this 2015 annual report reveals. Stop in soon - we're looking forward to exchanging our daily greeting with you, welcoming you back after a long absence, or meeting you for the first time. It certainly won't be the last.

FRIENDS OF THE MT. LEBANON PUBLIC LIBRARY

Friends of the Mt. Lebanon Public Library raised nearly \$80,000 for the library from The Book Cellar, a used book shop within the library operated entirely by volunteers (\$65,190+), and from two fundraising events: *Brews for a 'Chili' Night* in January (\$7,590) and *Beer Garden Bash* in August (\$6,051), both chaired by Bob Hagerty and M.A. Jackson. The Friends also published ten issues of *:more Friends*, the library's newsletter, edited by volunteer Kelly Lotter. More than 600 residents are members of the Friends.

GRANTS & AWARDS

Mt. Lebanon received its official designation as a Family Place Library when we were visited by the National Coordinator of Family Place Libraries who toured our library and wrote that we "have implemented [the] Family Place Libraries plan superbly." As a Family Place library, Mt. Lebanon joins a nationwide group of libraries that expand "the traditional role of children's services."

Dana Jones received the New Librarian Honors Award in "recognition of originality, inventive ability and demonstration of promise for continued growth in librarianship" at the annual Pennsylvania Library Association conference.

The Pennsylvania Citizens for Better Libraries (PCBL) selected our library to receive the 2015 Library Public Relations Award for our "more" branding and public awareness campaign. The committee was impressed by the concept of the campaign and the many ways we use it to promote the range of library services, resources, and activities.

David McKibben, Book Cellar coordinator, Garden Tour manager and publicist, and Friends board member, was named 2015 Friend of the Year by the Pennsylvania Citizens for Better Libraries.

CHANGING OF THE GUARD

Cynthia K. Richey, longtime Director of Mt. Lebanon Public Library, retired in October 2015



Cynthia K. Richey retired as the Director of Mt. Lebanon Public Library, after 32 years of service at the library. She had been Director since 1996. Cynthia's last day at the library was October 10. Cynthia's retirement celebration coincided with the library's fall fundraiser: A Novel Affair: Once Upon a Time. At that event, the Board of Trustees renamed the children's department "The Cynthia K. Richey Children's Library" in her honor.

Prior to coming to Mt. Lebanon Public Library in 1983, and serving as its Head of Children's Services for more than 10 years, Cynthia was the children's librarian at Pleasant Hills Public Library and at the Squirrel Hill Branch of Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh. Cynthia has received many local, state, and national honors, including a 2006 New York Times Librarian Award, one of only twenty-five librarians selected nationally, and the 2013 Distinguished Service Award from the Association for Library Service to Children, a division of the American Library Association for which she served as President in 2004.

"I love Mt. Lebanon Public Library and will miss working here more than anyone can know," Cynthia said in announcing her decision to retire. "I'll miss the programs, the wonderful community support, all of our partner organizations, and the building itself. But most of all, I'll miss the people. This is an extraordinary community, one with the best, most dedicated library staff, trustees, Friends of the Library, and volunteers. And the unflagging support of our patrons, elected officials, and municipality is unmatched in any quarter. I have been fortunate, indeed, to have had the opportunity to work here since 1983. It's been a privilege to help this library transform into one of the very best in the state and become the true center, the very heart, of our community."

Robyn E. Vittek Hired as New Library Director

The Library Board has hired Robyn E. Vittek as the new Director of Mt. Lebanon Public Library, starting November 1.

Robyn was previously the Director at St. Clairsville Public Library in St. Clairsville, Ohio, where she wrote several successful grants to improve children's and teen services and digital learning opportunities for the members of her community. An active member of the Rotary of St. Clairsville, Robyn recently transferred her membership to the Dormont-Mt. Lebanon-Castle Shannon Rotary Club.

Over a fourteen year career Robyn has been honored for her work in libraries and in professional associations. She was named an ALA Emerging Leader in 2010 and a member of the Library Leadership Ohio class of 2012. In 2011 she helped to found Take 5!, an ongoing dialogue and conference series on new ideas and creative approaches for people who work with teens and youth in libraries, museums, arts organizations, and other learning environments. In 2013, she served as the Chair of the Ohio Library Council's Convention and Expo, an event hosting over 700 attendees. Her writing has been published in professional publications and blogs, and she wrote a regular column for the Martins Ferry, OH Times-Leader.



"I am thrilled to be working in such a vibrant and dynamic library and community. The support from staff, the Board of Trustees, Friends and volunteers, the municipality and the patrons has been overwhelming. Mt. PROGRAM & SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS

MORE FUN

- Our “Downton Abbey” tea featured English-inspired food and trivia fun.
- Teens helped at Teen Volunteer Night and enjoyed Otaku Club, celebrating Japanese popular culture. Movie release parties for *Insurgent Part I* and *The Hunger Games: Mockingjay Part II* and a Teen Mini Comic Con were hosted by the Teen Advisory Board.
- The Summer Reading Program challenged patrons of all ages to read for fun and prizes. Hundreds of readers joined the Summer Reading program, *Every Hero Has a Story!*, for which 1,226 children read over 5,740 hours in 8 weeks.
- Children and their families enjoyed programs like the Annual Chess Tournament, Battle of the Books, the Annual MLPL/MLSD Mock Caldecott Election, Gingerbread House creating, “Happy Noon Year!”, the Annual Library Pet Show, the Stuffed Animal Sleepover, Touch-a-Truck, Bedtime Math, Superhero Cartooning Workshop, summer’s daily Creation Station, and Fright Night! Families also enjoyed Star Wars Day, Sunday Fundays, and Family Fort Night.

MORE TO LEARN

- The Mind Body Spirit programming series focused on an integrative approach to wellness.
- Gardeners learned about landscape design, creating a natural looking garden, gardening with roses, composting, and “toured” Mid-Atlantic Gardens.
- World Affairs discussions included health insurance and National Security Issues presented by U.S. Army War College.
- International Language Groups conversed in French, Italian, German, Chinese, and Spanish.
- Librarians visited the elementary schools to celebrate National Library Card Sign-up Month and to promote the Summer Reading Program.
- “Play & Learn Together: A Parent-Child Workshop” let children play while their parents learned from early childhood professionals.
- Kids in grades 5 & 6 were challenged by fun logic and math games and puzzles in “Club 24,” and participants in “Fall STEAM Ahead” gained skills in Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics.
- “Gadget Workshops” educated patrons about different social media platforms, including Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest.
- At the “Introduction to Computer Programming” workshop, children assembled and programmed a “Raspberry Pi” computer unit.

- Concerts included Steel City Ukuleles, The Squirrel Hillbillies, RML Jazz, and Mt. Lebanon High School String Quartet. Other music-themed programs explored the history of Pittsburgh Jazz, Jelly Roll Morton, coal mining songs, Wagner, Mahler, and a musical tribute to the CCC.
- The library hosted visits by photographer Nick Vargas from East End Studios, Bob the Juggler, Attack Theatre, Carnegie Science Center, and naturalist Verna McGinley.
- Families enjoyed the annual “Family Sing-a-Long” with Margaret Hooton and Bob Barnett.

MORE STORIES

- Author visits included Stewart O’Nan at the 2nd Annual Joseph Wertheim Memorial Lecture; Benny Zelkowitz, John Hampsey, Philip Beard, Jonah Winter, and the annual local author forum. Local poets Billie Nardoizzi and Samuel Hazo also made appearances.
- The Friends hosted Sara Shepard, who discussed her writing and the success of her *Pretty Little Liars* series.
- Fans of the written word could choose monthly from 16 book discussion groups or two writer’s groups.
- “Tail Waggin’ Tutors” allowed families to read to therapy dogs.
- “Get Ready to Read” helped preschoolers learn early literacy skills throughout the summer.
- Storytimes entertained babies, toddlers, preschoolers, Spanish, French, and sign language learners.

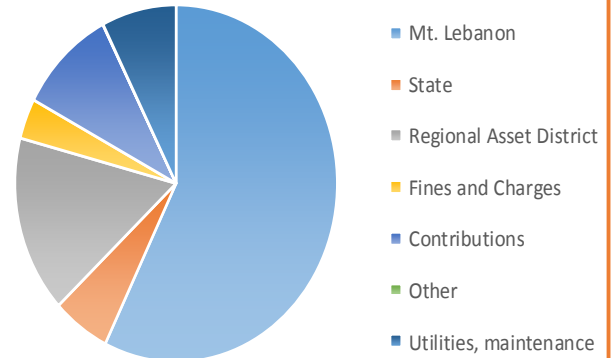

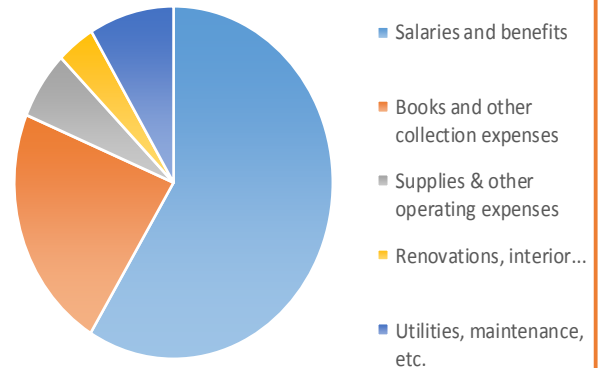
