### **Gather information**

- Interview
- Collect family records and stories
- What you get will be incomplete and sometimes inaccurate

### **Record information**

- Pedigree charts and family group sheets
- Note where a record came from
- Get it to paper? Will your media be accessible in 30 years?

### **Present information**

- Ancestral report – Realistically you need PC program to generate

**Software on your PC** – All will do the job, choice is a matter of taste. \$30 - \$40 (without add-ons). All have free trial editions. All transfer to each other and to online repositories. Some of the best known:

- Facebook – have to have a Facebook account, usually have to join, “Allegheny County PA Genealogy” has lots of very helpful people for local assistance

### **DNA 101**

- Three tests – Y-DNA – male line, mtDNA – female line (losing favor), Autosomal – looks across all lines for mutations, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> cousins max
- Three companies to test with
  - o [www.ancestry.com](http://www.ancestry.com) – largest database of possible matches to find cousins
  - o [www.23andme.com](http://www.23andme.com) – best at deep ancestry, 1,000 to 10,000 years ago = archeology, not genealogy, back doing genetic analysis
  - o [www.familytreedna.com](http://www.familytreedna.com) – best if you want to do your own exploration of chromosomes, only one still doing mtDNA
