Marilyn led us through a tour of the resources in the Pennsylvania Department, including newspapers, city directories, birth, marriage and death records, vertical files of miscellaneous items organized by topic, picture files, and much more. Marilyn and her staff will search their archives via requests that fit into the categories and year ranges at the prices shown in this link. Marilyn advised that a better (and free) source for the Sanborn Fire Insurance maps is the Penn State library. These are for the City of Pittsburgh (plus a few other local towns and many towns across Pennsylvania) and give detailed information about structures in Pittsburgh for the years 1884 to 1910.
