Because the Pennsylvania Department is an affiliate Family History Center, you can access certain online records from their databases that are only accessible (for contractual reasons) at Family History Centers or their affiliates. Like all libraries in Allegheny county, they have access to Ancestry.com. They also (unique to them among libraries) have access to Fold3, with it's collection of military, naturalization, and some additional newspapers.
