[www.newspapers.com](http://www.newspapers.com) - The biggest site with a very good search engine and highlighted results. \$29.95 for everything, 7.95 a month if you only need 1922 and before

The Post-Gazette Archives coverage of Pittsburgh coverage is outstanding, and only \$7.95 a month. It's a subset of the entire Newspapers.com site.

Once you have the newspaper, date and page from [newspapers.com](http://www.newspapers.com) you can use the next two sites for free to find the article:

Google newspaper archives [news.google.com/newspapers](http://news.google.com/newspapers) Find newspaper, enter date and page

Google search <https://www.google.com/> Put names in quotes, the city and the year. You'll have to click on the OCR tag and find the text. It won't be perfect, maybe even barely readable

Chronically America - [chroniclingamerica.loc.gov/](http://chroniclingamerica.loc.gov/) Not very easy to use. It just shows whole page images with search results in tiny red letters.

<http://panewsarchive.psu.edu/> has everything from Chronically America in PA and more. It just shows whole page images with search results in red, like Chronically America.

[www.fultonhistory.com/Fulton.html](http://www.fultonhistory.com/Fulton.html) It focuses on New York and New England but has newspapers from all over. Very good search, and shows part of the searched text so you can find useful articles.
