For this talk the woman with the unknown last name is Mrs. Unknown and her husband is Mr. Unknown. They are the parents of the person I call Ancestor.

Search death certificates for Mrs. Unknown, Ancestor and all of her children.

If your ancestors were Catholic and received sacraments in Allegheny County or one of the five surrounding counties (Beaver, Butler, Greene, Lawrence and Washington) the

Pittsburgh Diocese Archives will do a search for \$15.00 for one hour. Marriage records will have maiden names and birth records probably will . <https://diopitt.org/genealogy>

If Mrs. Unknown or her husband were immigrants, the records may include the town they came from in Europe. With that you can start to research your family there.
